the complex relationship between the rulers, the officers, and the ruled.

An international conference held at the German Historical Institute in London in November 2017 laid the groundwork for this volume. It assembled scholars from Britain, Germany, France, Spain, Portugal, the United States, and Italy and was generously funded by the Fritz Thyssen Foundation. I am grateful to the conference convenors, Hannes Ziegler (then GHI London, now Munich) and María Ángeles Martín Romera (then University College London, now Madrid), for leading the creative process of making the conference presentations into a well-rounded book. The GHIL's Angela Davies and Emily Richards expertly edited the essays and smoothed the manuscript's passage through the production process. I want to thank them as much as Oxford University Press staff and delegates, and of course the anonymous peer reviewers whose instructive comments helped improve the final outcome.
