Lars Bergman (born 1931), Ph.D., is professor emeritus in History at Lund University, Sweden. His research has mainly been focused on social and labor history, but also cultural history. Among other things, he has written about labor processes, trade union formation, work environment, labor legislation, and social rights struggles. His work has dealt on Stockholm's Shipyard in Malmö, Sweden in Sweden. More recently, he has studied conditions among Lewis and Clark workers in Mississippi during the 1920s and 1930s.

Tage Berglöf (born 1954), Ph.D. in history and sociology, is former at the University of Umeå in Sweden and at the University of Helsinki. His research interests are history of industrial relations, gender issues, class history, and transport history. He has published articles in Finnish, Nordic, and international journals and books. He is active in the four-volume History of the Central Organization of Finnish Trade Unions (OAJ), 2002, 2007, 2012, and 2018) and writing on a biography of the Finnish president Mauno Koivisto. First volume was published in 2012.

Peter Biese (born 1965), Ph.D., is senior researcher and coordinator of the research center 'Socio-history of work' affiliated at the Sociological Research Institute, University of Göttingen, Germany. In his Ph.D. dissertation *Wild Strife on Westdeutsche-see* (2007), he worked on comparison of strike movements and worker movements in Denmark and Germany. He was editor of the journal *Social History Online*.
